

Helichrysum trilineatum

Sesotho: Hukobetsi, Phefshoana-ea-loti

H: 3'-4'

W: 3'-4'

Light: Sun

Water: Dry-Moderate

Temperature: -20F

Foliage: Silvery blue

Flower: Yellow

Native Range: Drakensberg Mountains of South Africa and Lesotho

Description: Rarely seen in the nursery trade. Native to the high mountains of the Drakensberg, where it has evolved to withstand extreme temperatures and variable moisture. This shrub has attractive silver foliage that contrasts beautifully with its glowing yellow flowers. Fuzzy leaves and stems protect *H. trilineatum* from intense summer sun and insulate against frigid winter temperatures. In Lesotho where trees are scarce, the fragrant woody stems are often burned as fuel.

Adaptable to a wide variety of soil types, including clay.
